Chemical Jugs

(Coronation and Castor Transfer Stations)

It's that time of year when we see a lot of chemical jugs coming to the transfer stations. We are only allowed to accept chemical jugs, not chemical barrels or the totes. These can be returned to the retailer where they were purchased. Remember to rinse your jugs properly, remove all labels and caps before placing them in the chemical sheds. The boxes can be recycled at the cardboard bin.

Batteries

Car batteries are considered hazardous waste. We are not allowed to have these batteries on site. Take them to your local auto repair shop or implement dealer who are more than willing to recycle them for you. People continue to bring batteries and hide them so that the attendant can't see them. Please stop doing this.

Cell Phones

All transfer stations handle the recycling of cell phones. All you have to do is give the Attendant your cell phone and they will handle it for you.

Holiday Trailers on Roadways in Town

Now that camping season is in full swing; please remember – you may only park your trailer on the street in front of your property for up to 72 hours. During that time it must be hooked up to a vehicle. This is for the purpose of loading or unloading only. You may park your trailer on your boulevard during the summer months providing it does not interfere with pedestrian or vehicle traffic. Standards ByLaw #1038

Property in Town not adhering to the Standards Bylaw **will be issued a fine.** There will be no warning calls. Property that may be fined is property that shows signs of a serious disregard for general maintenance and upkeep, whether or not it is detrimental to the surrounding area, some examples include:

- (a) excessive accumulation of material including but not limited to building materials, appliances, household goods, boxes, tires, vehicle parts, whether of any apparent value or not.
- (b) any loose litter, garbage, construction debris or refuse whether located in a storage area or elsewhere on the land;
- (c) damaged, dismantled or derelict Motor Vehicles or trailers, whether insured or registered or not;
- (d) smelly or messy compost heaps;
- (e) grass higher than 15 centimetres;
- (f) excessive and noxious weeds;
- (g) production of excessive dust, dirt or smoke;
- (h) production of any general offensive odours;
- (i) any tree, shrub, other type of vegetation or any structure that:
 - * interferes or could interfere with any public work or utility;
 - * obstructs any Sidewalk adjacent to the land;
 - * impairs the visibility required for safe traffic flow at any intersection adjacent to the land; or
 - * has any rot or other deterioration;
- (j) any accessible excavation, ditch, drain or standing water that could pose a danger to the public; or
- (k) any exterior damage or deterioration to a Building, including but not limited to peeling, unpainted or untreated surfaces, missing siding, shingles, windows or doors, or any other hole or opening in the building.

Castor Cemetery

Memorialization is an honor to the deceased but it is also a service to the living. The very act of visiting a site and seeing the deceased's name provides comfort and closure.

Memorialization is not just for family and friends, but for everyone whose lives were touched by the deceased, we can't begin to presume who these people could be. It is also for the generations that follow who will want to connect with their heritage.

For these reasons, the Town of Castor has made it a priority to bring our cemeteries to a higher standard of maintenance. Many graves and headstones are sinking and the work to fix them is costly and time consuming. In 2014, through donations, over 40 grave covers were removed and many headstones straightened. Donations toward this project would be gratefully accepted by the Town and a donation receipt for tax purposes would be issued.
