#### General Recycling

The amount of general recycling materials continues to increase in volume and the program is working very well. Please continue to use the general recycling program. **Do Not Place** any styrofoam, wood, clothing, or construction products in the general recycling. This type of material must be removed prior to pick up.

#### White Metals

All three transfer stations accept all types of white metals such as fridges, freezers, hot water tanks, washers, dryers, microwaves, and water dispensers. There is no charge for bringing these materials for recycling. The only thing we ask is that all food be removed from the fridges and freezers.

#### Barbed Wire

All sites accept barbed wire in our metal recycling. If you wish to bring the wire, please have it rolled up and all wooden posts have been removed from the wire. The posts have to be removed, otherwise the recyclers refuse to take the wire.

#### **Hazardous Materials**

We still encounter hazardous materials brought to the site, usually hidden in the paint bins or in the chemical container buildings. Any materials such as agriculture chemical, household type cleaners, medical supplies (needles) and used oils are not allowed on the sites. These materials can be recycled by taking them to the Household Hazardous Waste Roundup, local fuel dealers, or check with your local drug stores regarding medical waste materials. This way the material is recycled and does not pose a risk to the sites and the operations under Environmental Regulations.
